How MISOM Works

Our Purpose

The Michigan District School of Ministry exists to provide training for those sensing a call to ministry.

The school seeks to promote a unified purpose for ministry within the Fellowship, providing both doctrinal and practical instruction based upon common core values and shared ministry goals. MISOM courses are also an excellent resource for anyone interested in broadening their understanding of Scripture and all are welcome to register and attend.



The Structure

Classes are conducted monthly September to May each year. Three courses are offered each month, one for each corresponding credential level (Certified, Licensed, and Ordained). Students participate in five hours of classroom instruction and a final exam is taken and scored during the session.

Prior to class, each student is required to work through the course textbook and Text Overview. A minimum of ten (10) hours or more of preparatory work is necessary. With the classroom time, students will have invested fifteen (15) hours or more per course.

Some Is and Is Not about MISOM.

MISOM is NOT a college or university. Individuals who are able to attend college or seminary are strongly encouraged to attend an endorsed A/G college or seminary for the absolute best in ministerial training.

MISOM is NOT an accredited school. Students must not expect that their MISOM courses will be accepted by any A/G college, Bible school or other accredited college. However, some AG schools do accept classes for credit.



MISOM IS about helping those who want to grow in their understanding of the Bible and ministry, but who cannot break away to pursue a four-year degree. It provides the instruction, interaction, accountability and relationships that are not available through correspondence courses.

MISOM IS for those who need to complete their educational requirements for credentialing within the Assemblies of God.

MISOM IS for lay persons who may not be interested in credentials or full-time ministry but who want to learn more about the Bible and improve their ability to serve Christ and their church.

MISOM IS for credentialed ministers who want to improve their skills and participate in a worthwhile continuing education process.

Endorsement

The Michigan District School of Ministry (MISOM) is a member of the Association of District Schools of Ministry (ADSOM) and has been recognized and approved by the Executive Presbytery of the General Council of the Assemblies of God. Courses required for Assemblies of God credentials as successfully completed at MISOM meet General Council educational requirements for each respective level of credential.
